**TRASK SHOT IN AIR  
TO FRIGHTEN SMITH**

Latter Then Turned Round  
and Killed Officer, Who  
Fired Again

The question as to when Deputy Sheriff Frank **Trask** got in the shot that stopped the fleeing tramp, Boyd Smith, at Benson on the night of May 10 was not definitely cleared up at the inquest, according to news that has reached Bisbee.

From the testimony offered at the inquest it appears that **Trask** fired the first shot, shooting into the air to stop the fleeing tramp. Whereupon, Smith turned and shot three times at **Trask**, one of the shots, the fatal one, entering the officer's heart. But as, it is stated, the officer's bullet entered Smith's back; the latter must have been running at the time, fleeing from the officer, leading to the supposition that **Trask** fired after he received his fatal wound or that Smith's wound was received before **Trask** was hit in the heart. The question as to which one of the three shots was fired by Smith is the solution and no evidence tending to unravel this question was offered, so after the west-bound train arrived in the yards, Constable **Trask** was making his rounds and just as the train was pulling out of the yards, Trask noticed a man swing beneath one of the coaches and notified him to get off, whereupon the man demanded **Trask** to show his authority, and asked if he were the yard switchman.

In the meantime the officer exhibited his star to Smith, who then remarked, "You are only the constable here," and started to run away. In an effort to stop the man, **Trask** fired a shot in the air so as to frighten him, but instead Smith turned around, drew his six-shooter and fired three shots at the officer, one taking effect in the leg, another in the abdomen, while the third shot entered the heart. During the firing Trask also shot at Smith, the same lodging in the left lung, causing him to stagger, but still making his effort to get away.

He was a native of Maine but moved to Toulumme county, California in 1849, where he resided for twenty-five years, thence going to Los Angeles, Cal., where he engaged in farming and stock raising. In the fall of 1882 he came to Benson where he resided until the time of his death. The funeral ceremonies conducted by Rev. David Roberts, of Tombstone, were very solemn and impressive and were largely attended. 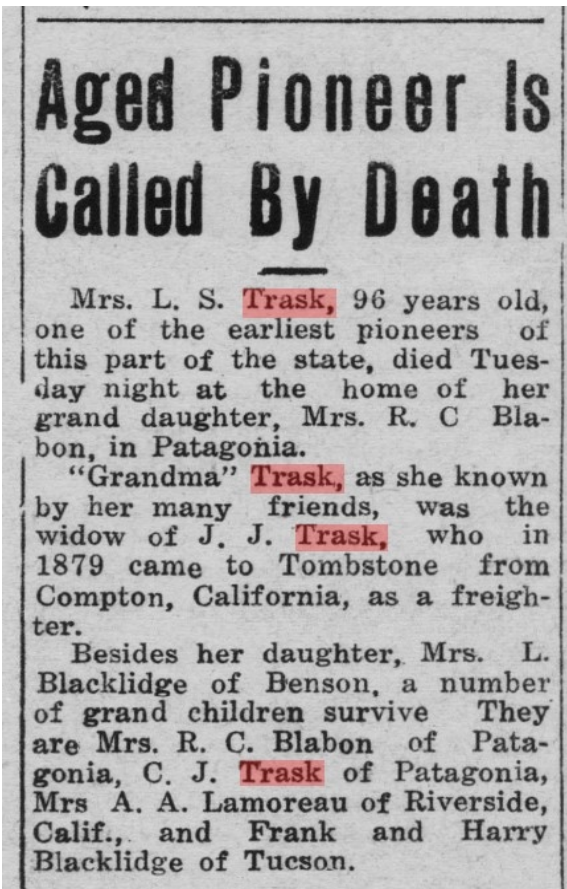

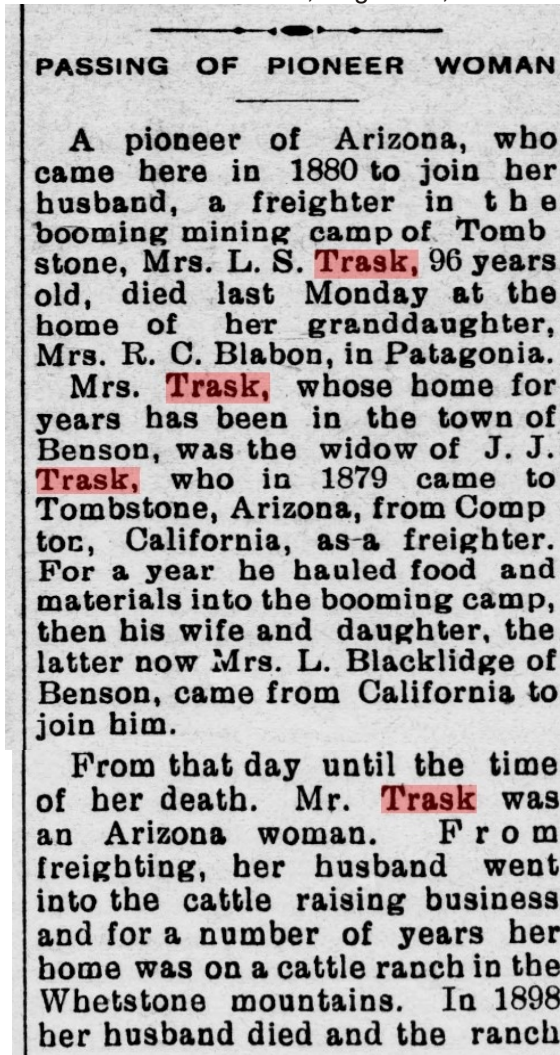

On or about the 29th of this month Cochise County will send thirty-two men to Camp Funston, who will make up the county's full quota of the original draft Benson has two representatives in the list, Vicente **Manzo** and Wm. R. Ohnesorgen.

As previously mentioned in this paper, there were two eligibles drawn from Benson in this call. They were Vicente **Manzo**, long employed with the Benson Lumber Company, and Will Ohnesorgen, son of a well known pioneer citizen.

The Benson signal., November 30, 1918

Among those who were listed as severely wounded in one of last week's casualty reports was Vicente **Manzo**, a Benson soldier at the front in France. A telegram had some time before been received by his parents here saying he had been wounded in action September 16th. Now a telegram has come saying he had died from the effects of his wounds at a hospital in France. No further particulars were obtainable up to the time of going to press.

**Editor's Note:**

Few persons in Benson and the vicinity know anything about Vicente V. Manzo for whom the local post of the American Legion is named. So as Memorial Day draws near, it was thought fitting to publish a sketch of his life from material assembled by Mrs. Sadie Martinez, Community Service Chairman, American Legion Auxiliary.

Vicente V. Manzo was born August 5, 1893, near Tucson, Arizona. His parents Refugio and Juana Manzo, were living at that time in a small farming district then known as La Laguna. He had two sisters, both of whom are dead. One sister was the mother of Frank M. Sosa, former manager of the J. Knox Corbett Lumber and Hardware Co., in Benson. The other sister was the mother of Mrs. Alice Soza Cota of Benson and Luisa Soza Molina of Tucson.

When Vicente was around ten years old, the Manzo family moved to the San Pedro valley, settling in the upper St. David, near where the Steve Miller ranch is located. The father was engaged in truck farming, while Vicente attended the St. David School.

After four years of farming the family moved to Benson, where they remained two years, from 1907 to 1909. Again Vicente and his father took up farming. This time they farmed part of the old Meeker ranch upon which the Apache Powder Company later established its camp while powder plant at Curtis was under construction.

When Vicente was around twenty years old, the Manzos moved back to Benson to establish a permanent home, while Vicente supported the family by working for different concerns. He was employed for a while by the Southern Pacific Company at its roundhouse, then located in Benson. He also worked for Benson Transfer Company while it was owned by Sam Wilson. For a while he was working for the Benson Lumber and Commercial Co. This later became the K. Knox Corbett Lumber and Hardware Co. and at the present time is the Foxworth-Killen Lumber Co

At the time Vicente Manzo was drafted for service, he left an aged father, mother, and three young relatives who depended upon his wages for support. Inducted into service March 31, 1918, he was sent for military training to Camp Funston, Kansas. At first he was a member of 22 Co., 164 Dep. Brigg., but was soon transferred, on April 24, 1918, to company D 355 infantry, 89 Division, where he remained until his death. Vicente was awarded the Purple Heart for his wounds and death.

"May his soul rest in peace"

By June 4, his outfit was overseas, where it later engaged in the San Mihiel Drive. Manzo was wounded in action on September 15, and died in a field hospital in France on November 10, 1918. His death was caused by complications resulting from the wounds.

Two years after the war was over the U.S. Government had his body returned to Benson for Burial. The following account of the ceremony is recorded from a clipping from the Tombstone Epitaph of November 21, 1920 which reads as follows:

Benson, Arizona, Nov. 20. - All business houses were closed in Benson yesterday during the Holy Mass offered up for the soul of Vicente Manzo, who had been brought back from France for burial in his native land.

"The church was filled to overflowing and many were compelled to remain on the outside during the divine services.

Vicente Manzo, who died in action in France, was buried from our Lady of Lourdes church with military honors. The obsequies were conducted and the funeral sermon preached by Rev. Father Wm. Jno. Leaver, of Tombstone. Officers and soldiers from various Arizona forts were present.

All the children of the Benson Schools were allowed to attend, each child holding an American flag in hand. After the incensing or blessing of the grave and corpse, and the chanting of the "Ego Sum Resurrecto" by Father Leaver, the school children united in singing "America", as the remains of Vicente Manzo were lowered to their final resting place.

"The military salute of honor was fired over the grave by six soldiers. A bugler sounded "Taps" as the finale of the program while those in attendance had literally buried the double casket, draped with a large and beautiful American flag, with an ocean of flowers. Prior to his enlistment in Company B, 335th infantry, 89th Division, Ww1, the Benson Red Cross aided in issuing the final certificate to his heirs for the homestead of 640 acres.

Vicente Manzo gave his life for his country, and the people of Benson truly demonstrated that their townsman's memory still lives in the minds and hearts of those who knew him as one of the village's boys.

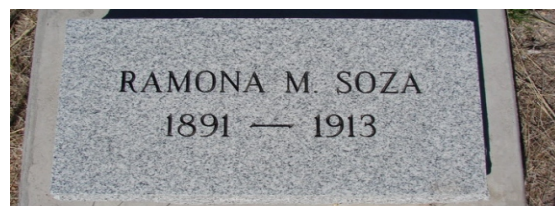

### Death of Mrs. Paul Blanco

Just as we are going to press the sad news is learned of the death of Mrs. Paul Blanco, about 5 o'clock this morning at her home in this place. She had been under the care of a physician for several days but was not considered in a dangerous condition. Dr. Franklin, who attended her last evening says when he left her she seemed to be in no danger of death, was cheerful and apparently improving.

### Additional Details of **Accident** at Benson

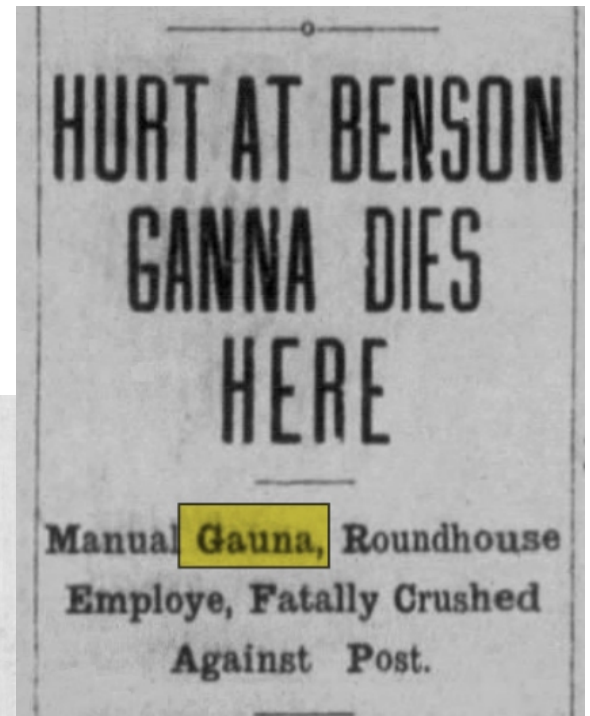
The Benson Press has the following additional details of the death of Manuel Guana, mention of which was made in THE PROSPECTOR:

Manuel Guana, a native of Benson, employed at the Southern Pacific round house, and who acted as call boy, was fatally crushed on Friday morning of last week between an engine and a pillar.

He was riding on the steps between the tender and engine, with his back toward the pillar, which came in contact with him as the engine en-

tered the round house, the roof of which this pillar is one of the supports. As the steps pass within two inches of the pillar, the unfortunate man was crushed so that death resulted about 11 o'clock the same morning at the hospital in Tucson, where he was taken on No. 7. Burial which occurred in Benson Saturday morning, was well attended.

Manuel Ganna, an employe of the Southern Pacific round house at Benson, was fatally crushed this morning between an engine and a post. With a part of the round house crew he was riding on the tender of the engine, and in attempting to alight while the locomotive was in motion, he was propelled against a post with such violence that internal



injuries in the stomach and abdominal region resulted. These were of so serious a nature that after temporary medical aid had been given him, he was brought into Tucson on the No. 7 train and taken to St. Mary's hospital. He died about 11 o'clock.

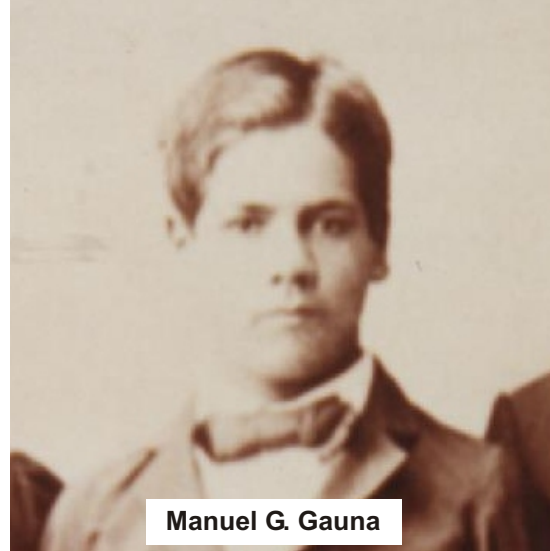
Ganna was 22 years of age and well known here in Tucson, although a native of Benson. He was employed by the railroad company as a call-boy and mechanic in the round-house. Several of his friends accompanied him to the hospital.

An inquest will be held on the body late this afternoon, and the exact nature and extent of the injuries ascertained. After the conclusion of the inquest the body will be shipped back to Benson for interment.

**DRAGGED TO DEATH.**

**The Fatal Accident Which Befell Willie McFarland.**

One of the most heart rending accidents it has been our duty to chronicle, befell the nine year old son of our townsman, Mr. S. R. **McFarland**. This gentleman was in Pantano yesterday, in the discharge of his duties, and was accompanied by Willie. While there the lad was placed upon a horse which made a few turns in the vicinity quite quietly, but at last quickened his pace while some distance from the lookers on, among whom was his father, and before they could assist him, was thrown, his foot remaining in the stirrup, in which position he was dragged to death in the sight of his agonized parent, who was powerless to render him any assistance until too late.



All too late indeed, it was, although but a few short minutes, when the horror stricken group caught the horse and extracted the child. He was a painful sight to witness. The scalp torn completely from his head, and skull cracked; arms broken and thigh terribly mutilated. Tender hands removed him but life was extinct.

Willie was an uncommonly bright lad, one of those that we pick out and remember as little men among boys, a favorite among his school fellows and the community generally. His sad fate will long be remembered and deplored.

The grief stricken parents have indeed the warmest sympathy of all, in this sad bereavement.

The remains were buried here to-day, and followed to the grave by the entire community.

#### Death of Willie McFarland.

The death of little Willie McFarland, son of roadmaster McFarland, at Pantano, a few days since, appears to have been an exceedingly sad one. Mr. McFarland resides at Benson, but in the routine of his business, frequently has occasion to go to Pantano. On these trips he was generally accompanied by his son Willie. The latter, while in Pantano, made his home with Judge Woolfolk, who thoroughly admired him as a bright and intelligent boy. On the day of his death he was visiting with Mr. Woolfolk and inquired of him if he was going to drive his light buckboard that day as he wanted to ride with him in case he did. The Judge replied No, but said he had a gentle saddle mare he (Willie) could ride if he wished.

The animal was accordingly saddled, but as the stirrups were too long the little fellow's feet were put in the straps. As he was unaccustomed to riding he was instructed not to go beyond sight. The journey to and from the depot had been made several times, Judge Woolfolk and Mr. McFarland keeping the horse and rider close under observation. The last time, however, Willie failed to turn the horse as before, and the animal becoming somewhat irritated, started to trot and the boy fell off with his left foot still hanging in the strap.

At this the mare became frantic and galloped madly around kicking the poor little fellow at every step. Judge Woolfolk finally caught her and in doing so was knocked violently to the ground. As he fell the almost lifeless and horribly mutilated body of the boy was thrown into his arms, covering him with blood. The father was by his side in a moment, but the little fellow gave one gasp and was dead. The grief of the father was intense, but scarcely less was that of Judge Woolfolk, who had given him the horse to ride.

The animal in question had always been considered well behaved and gentle. Had the boy when falling, not been entangled in the stirrup straps, he would have been uninjured, but dragging and striking the mare's heels made her uncontrollable.

This death, coming as it did, was peculiarly sad and heartrending. It was one of those unfortunate affairs that bring sorrow in its wake alike to family and friend. No blame could be attached to anyone, but Judge Woolfolk from whom the above facts were obtained, grieves sorely over the sad and untimely ending of what promised so fair to be a useful and prosperous life.

The funeral took place from his home, in Benson, on the 25th inst.

### ANOTHER FORMER RESIDENT FROM TUCSON THAT DISAPPEARS

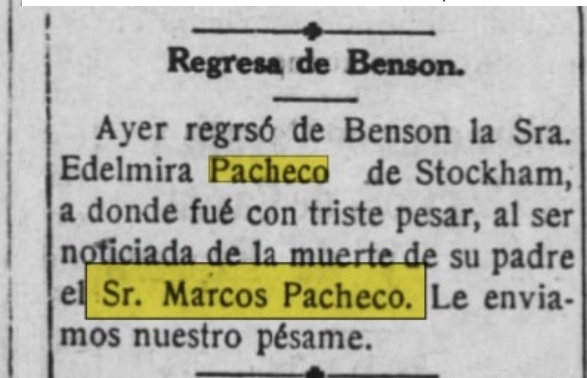
