The San Juan River

Float trips travel from Bluff to Mexican and on to Clay Hills. This quiet river, with only a few stretches of active water, harbors "sand waves" which provide an unexpected roller coaster ride. Tour operators focus on the natural and human history along the river. Campground at Sand Island where a large petroglyph panel reveals multiple images of Kokopelli, the hump backed flute player of southwestern mythology. Located 4 miles W of Bluff at Sand Island Boat Launch Area. Allow 1 hour for rock art panel.







Comb Wash is a deep, wide canyon splitting the landscape from the Abajo Mountains to the San Juan River. Hidden along its length are Ancestral Puebloan ruins and rock art for those willing to search. Comb Ridge, on the eastern side of the wash, presented an impassable barrier to the pioneers who were forced to travel along it to the river to bypass its height. Located 7.5 miles west of Bluff. Allow 3 hours for cursory exploration.

NEAR MEXICAN HAT

Nestled amid deep red sandstone cliffs, Mexican Hat is named for the inverted sandstone sombrero which is north of the town. The community is home to several trading posts, motels, restaurants, and is a launch site for San Juan River Trips. Population: 26. Elevation: 4,350.





Goosenecks State Park

The longest entrenched river meander in North America gives this small park its name and spectacular views. The river twists and turns, covering more than 6 miles while advancing less than 2 miles toward Lake Powell. The park offers visitors a close-up view of geology in the raw. Eons of geologic activity are on view. The canyon is 1,500 ft deep and layers are easily seen. Camping & fees. No water. 9 Miles NW of Mexican Hat via US163, US261, and U316. Allow 1 hr.







Grand Gulch Primitive Area

The Ancestral Puebloans inhabited this area over 700 years ago. This canyon, cut into Cedar Mesa, shelters petroglyphs, pictographs, archaeological structures, and artifacts. Travel is restricted to foot or horseback, and camping requires a permit from the BLM. (435-587-1500). Access to Grand Gulch from Kane Gulch Ranger Station is a 5 hour hike. Many day hikes are possible throughout the Cedar Mesa area. Detailed maps are recommended. Ranger station at Kane Gulch, signed. Allow 3 hrs to multiple days.





Moki Dugway / Muley Point

A "dugway" is a road or trail along a hillside which is dug out to provide a path for transport. Built in the 1950s during the uranium boom by Texas Zinc Minerals to provide a route for ore haulers from the mines on Cedar Mesa to the mill near Mexican Hat, the Moki Dugway is an 11% grade on gravel. If you don't mind heights, the views from the road and the overlook at the top are worth the trip. Views of Valley of the Gods and in the distance Monument Valley on the southern horizon. Muley Point offers another great view from the canyon's edge into John's Canyon. Dugway: 13 miles NW of Mexican Hat on US 261. Muley Point: 18 miles NW of Mexican Hat (Co Rd 241- native surface) Allow 2 hours for the Dugway, 1 hour for Muley Point.

NEAR MONUMENT VALLEY

Monument Valley, known world-wide, is the quintessential western landscape and the location of many movies. To the Navajo people it is home. The best way to see the valley and the stunning scenery, is to take a tour with a native guide. Guided tours leave from the Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park visitor center or from Goulding's Lodge. Visit the original trading post, see the film "Earth Spirit", eat at a table with a view, see a Navaio weaver at work, and visit the movie museum.

Nestled at the foot of towering sandstone cliffs, Goulding's Lodge offers a museum in the original 1926 residence with special emphasis on the Navajo people and the films made in the valley.
