Edge of the Cedars State Park Museum has a collection of ancient Native American pottery and artifacts unequaled the world over. Recapture Canyon and its reservoir will keep hikers and fishermen occupied with archaeological sites down the canyon, and pike and trout up the canyon on the other side of the dam. Natural Bridges National Monument, Lake Powell and the archaeological sites in and around Comb Ridge and Cedar Mesa are all a day trip from this centrally-located base camp.



HITE - LAKE POWELL

Historic Hite is a flooded ghost town at the north end of Lake Powell named after Cass Hite, an early settler. Hite is adjacent to the confluence of the Colorado and Dirty Devil Rivers and is the gateway to southeast Utah's most scenic and adventurous places including Canyonlands, Sundance Trail, Dark Canyon, White Canyon, the Black Hole, and Lake Powell. NATURAL BRIDGES NATIONAL MONUMENT

Three majestic natural bridges invite you to ponder the power of water in a landscape usually defined by its absence. View them from an overlook, or hit the trails and experience their grandeur from below. Declared a National Monument in 1908, Natural Bridges was also designated the first International Dark Sky Park in 2007.



HOVENWEEP NATIONAL MONUMENT

Once home to over 2,500 people, Hovenweep includes six prehistoric villages built between A.D. 1200 and 1300. Explore a variety of structures and towers perched on canyon rims and balanced on boulders. The construction and attention to detail will leave you marveling at the skill and motivation of the builders.

HOUSE ON FIRE & BEARS EARS NATIONAL MONUMENT

Bears Ears is home to thousands of archaeological and cultural sites that are well over 13,000 years old, Ancestral Puebloans built dwellings, granaries, kivas, towers, villages, and an ancient road system linking them together. The numerous and varied collections of sites are found in the southern unit of the Monument.

THE DINOSAUR MUSEUM

The Dinosaur Museum, one of the best and most unique museums in the country, if not the world, is located here in Blanding. There are two main reasons for this distinction. The first is that The Dinosaur Museum has the complete history of the world of dinosaurs and some of the most complete displays and rarest artifacts in the paleo world. The second reason to visit this museum is that the incredible displays were all made by hand by the two founders of the museum, Stephen and Sylvia Czerkas. Not only are they both accomplished paleontologists and sculptors, they have a connection to Hollywood as well. Stephen Czerkas spent his early career sculpting dinosaurs and other creatures for the Motion Picture Industry. The museum houses the largest collection of dinosaur and reptile-related movie memorabilia on display in the world, as well as a fascinating exhibit on the huge role of dinosaurs in pop culture, media, and movies.

In 1981, Stephen's career transitioned into commissions for life-size dinosaurs for museums all over the world. Sylvia, who runs the museum now, has a background in art and lights up when asked about the displays. There is also a display of petrified trees. They're older than the dinosaurs themselves, and of the six specimens of this quality in the world, Blanding has three. It is an unexpected treat to have a museum on the level of the Dinosaur Museum located in a small town like Blanding.

NATIONS OF THE FOUR CORNERS

A great hiking trail that is representative of the region's many backcountry hikes, but it sits on the edge of Blanding! A historical site and hikes for the whole family. Be sure to walk the natural bridge!

THE DINOSAUR MUSEUM

At The Dinosaur Museum, you will experience the complete history of the dinosaurs including; skeletons, fossilized skin, eggs, footprints, state-of-the-art graphics, and realistic sculptures.

Blanding City's Wellness Center features two full-size basketball courts that can also be utilized for volleyball and pickleball. It also has a fitness center and an aerobics classroom. The outdoor pool is open seasonly in the summer months.

FIVE KIVA PUEBLO

Five Kiva Pueblo is unique because it's literally in the city limits! A short hike across the canyon on a well-marked trail leads to an alcove where you can see the remnants of Ancestral Pueblan dwellings.


