MONTICELLO






Nestled at the base of the Abajo Mountains, Monticello is the county seat of San Juan County. At just over 7,000 feet in elevation, Monticello boasts cool temperatures in the summer and recreational opportunities for nearly everyone. The Hideout Golf Course, one of the finest municipal courses in the country, winds its way through the canyons and foothills just below the Abajos. Lloyd's Lake Recreation Area has just over two miles of improved walking trail where the observant walker may catch a glimpse of blue herons, deer, elk and wild turkeys. The trail supplies one with views to the east of the Colorado Plateau and the peaks of the Abajos to the West. Trout and blue gill in the reservoir will keep the most avid fisherman busy. Located at the crossroads of two major highways, Monticello is the perfect base camp for adventures into the wildest canyons of Canyon Country, and the same historic trails Butch Cassidy and his Wild Bunch once roamed.

The Monticello Flour Mill was built in 1933 and operated for 30 years before closing in 1963. In 1985 the building was converted into a bed and breakfast, but much of the machinery was kept and the B&B was designed around it. The 3-story building features 7 rooms with private baths as well as a sitting room with fire place, a theater room, a library, and the Granary Bar & Grill, which is located inside one of the old grain silos.



EXPLORE THE NIGHT SKY AT CANYON COUNTRY DISCOVERY CENTER

San Juan County, Utah is home to some of the darkest night skies in the country with five Dark Sky Parks. Canyon Country Discovery Center hosts dark sky programs throughout the year. Regularly scheduled Star Parties offer visitors the opportunity to view the night sky though the permanently mounted 14" Meade telescope in their observatory.

HIKE TO CHESLER PARK IN THE NEEDLES DISTRICT OF CANYONLANDS

This hike is a great introduction to the diverse landscape of Canyonlands National Park. Spectacular panoramic views of the namesake Cedar Mesa Sandstone spires that Needles was named after seem endless. This 5.8 mile round trip hike begins over sandstone and crosses through canyons, washes, and a couple narrow joints (similar to slots) before reaching Chesler Park. This diverse hike won't disappoint!

NEEDLES OVERLOOK

Needles Overlook, a rock cliff 1,600 feet above the Needles District of Canyonlands National Park, offers nearly 360-degree views of the sandstone formations lining the horizon. Located one hour northwest of Monticello, the views at Needles Overlook are just as spectacular as Island in the Sky and Dead Horse Point State Park but without the crowds or entrance fees.

20 miles N of Monticello & 23 miles W on Hwy 133 (1 hour/43 miles NW of Monticello)



INDIAN CREEK UNIT OF BEARS EARS NATIONAL MONUMENT

Drive Scenic Byway 211 through Indian Creek to the border of the Needles District of Canyonlands National Park. Stop at Newspaper Rock to view one of the largest petroplyph panels in the country where more than 2,000 years worth of petroglyphs representing Archaic, Ancestral Puebloan, Fremont, Navajo, and Anglo cultures are showcased. Indian Creek is also a world renowned rock climbing destination.

CROSS COUNTRY SKI OR SNOWSHOE ON GROOMED TRAILS

6 miles of groomed cross country ski and snowshoe trails located at Dalton Springs Winter Recreation Area, just 5 miles west of Monticello.

SILVER QUEEN MINE MINIATURE GOLF COURSE

Black light miniature golf located inside the Monticello Mercantile.

MOUNTAIN BIKE ABAJO MOUNTAINS

An hour south and 3000 feet higher in elevation than Moab, the Abajo Mountains, just minutes from Monticello, boast a mix of single track and two track on trails without the crowds. Robertson's Pasture, Bulldog, Shay Ridge, and Wagon Wheel, to name a few. Stop by Roam Industry for maps, shuttles, guided rides, rentals, and gear.

HORSEBACK RIDING

A variety of multi-use trails can be accessed only minutes from Monticello on the Abajo Mountains in the Manti-La Sal National Forest.

MILLSITE/LLOYD'S LAKE

Walking and biking trails on the south end of Monticello. Fishing dock, pavillion, volleyball court, and picnic facilities at Lloyd's Lake.

BIG 4 TRACTOR AT THE MONTICELLO VISITOR CENTER

Monticello's Big 4 Tractor is one of only a few still in existence today! Restored by local volunteers, the Big 4 can be seen year-round at the Monticello Visitor Center, and each July it makes an appearance in the Monticello Pioneer Day Parade!

PIONEER PARK

Explore this park containing replicas of historic Monticello buildings.

SCENIC DRIVE - HART'S POINT ROAD TO HWY 211

This back road to Canyonlands and Indian Creek offers access to Lloyd's, Monticello, and Foy Lakes, as well as Dalton Springs and Buckboard Campgrounds – all located in the Manti-La Sal National Forest.

NEWSPAPER ROCK/INDIAN CREEK UNIT OF BEARS EARS NATIONAL MONUMENT

A 200 sq/ft petroglyph panel showcasing more than 2,000 years worth of petroglyphs.

CAMPING IN THE ABAJO MOUNTAINS

Two primitive USFS campgrounds are located in the Abajos within minutes of Monticello; Dalton Springs – 5 miles, and Buckboard – 6.5 miles. Dispersed camping is also available throughout the Manti-La Sal National Forest allowing campers easy access to 4WD, ATV, fishing, hunting, hiking, etc.

CLIMBING IN INDIAN CREEK

Known for its sandstone crack climbing, Indian Creek is a world-renowned rock climbing destination located in the northern unit of Bears Ears National Monument.

SPRING/SUMMER SWIMMING AT INDIAN CREEK FALLS

A great place to cool off in late spring/early summer! Located past Hamburger Rock Campground on Lockhart Basin Rd approximately 17 miles past Newspaper Rock.

ATV HOOK & LADDER

A maze of trails with unprecedented views of the La Sal Mountains and the back side of Wilson Arch, as well as red rock fins, canyons, and overlooks.


